Many of the security vulnerabilities that allow malware to spread and hackers to take control of your device can be fixed by applying security updates from Microsoft, Apple, Google, etc. It's also important to keep your mobile apps up-to-date with the latest security updates from Google Play and the iTunes App Store. Flexera Personal Software Inspector (PSI) is a great tool to ensure that apps such as Adobe Reader, Adobe Flash Player, and Java are kept up-to-date on your PC.
