Some of the benefits Platinum cardholders receive are: \$100,000 travel insurance, rental car collision insurance, purchase warranty protection, and concierge service.

- The Business Cash Back card earns 1% cash back on all business purchases up to the first \$100,000 in annual spending tiers or minimums, and includes a \$79 annual fee.
